A Word from the Pastor

In the bulb there is a flower, in the seed, an apple tree, In cocoons, a hidden promise: butterflies will soon be free! In the cold and snow of winter there's a spring that waits to be, Unrevealed until its season, something God alone can see.

As I write these words, the weather forecasters – and Punxatawney Phil – are telling us there are six more weeks of winter to endure. Are we surprised? As we make our way through an atypically mild season, save for a few days here and there, we find ourselves searching for signs of new life hidden in the fields shorn of their crops and gardens bereft of buds.

We are also assured that God can see life where we cannot. There's "a spring that waits to be," the hymnwriter reminds us. When temperatures plunge below freezing and ice-covered driveways threaten to throw us off our footing, we are tempted to declare that promise futile. And then something, or someone, comes along to give us a glimpse of hope for a new season to come.

Strange as it may sound, that hope has come to me daily through the songs of the workmen prepping our building for refurbishment. Even in the cold of winter, they have come eager to work. Happy to wield hammers and drills, removing what no longer offers us protection from the elements and building



what will, one layer at a time. The melody of their voices provides a cheerful counterpart to the clanging and banging of their tools.

One day soon, this work will draw to a close, capped off with a final layer of stucco to protect and beautify this house of worship. And we will rededicate our building to the work of God — however God reveals that to us — for the foreseeable future. As joyous as that day will be, it will also serve to remind us that the promise of things to come resides not in any building but in the people that flow in and out of it.

We are God's promise to one another, to our neighbors and to the larger community. Inside each one of us, and within this body of Christ, lie gifts just waiting to be revealed. Things God can use to bless others through nurture of mind, body and spirit. In the midst of winter, it can be difficult for us to imagine that we could possibly have anything worth giving to another – until the sound of their singing penetrates our weariness and we soon find ourselves joining in!

There's a song in every silence, seeking word and melody; There's a dawn in every darkness, bringing hope to you and me. From the past will come the future; what it holds, a mystery, Unrevealed until its season, something God alone can see.

This was the promise of God that Natalie Sleeth knew. An organist and composer of hymns and choral music, she married a professor of homiletics. Together, their lives were dedicated to the church and to the glory of God. Mrs. Sleeth's "Hymn of Promise" was composed in early 1985, and dedicated simply "To Ron," her husband, who was diagnosed with cancer and died weeks after its premiere. Soon after the anthem was published, it became a hymn under two different names. You can find it in our hymnal: it's hymn #250, "In the Bulb There is a Flower." In the coldest seasons of our lives, her hymn speaks of the dawn in every darkness. Can we do less?

In our end is our beginning, in our time, infinity; in our doubt there is believing, in our life, eternity, in our death, a resurrection, at the last, a victory, unrevealed until its season, something God alone can see.

Christian Life Groups


CLG's will meet in our traditional format on 2/5, 2/12 and 2/19.

The Gospels are full of stories of Jesus sharing meals with disciples, friends, even tax collectors and Pharisees. Whether multiplying bread to feed a whole crowd, relaxing with his inner circle, or telling curious elites stories about even greater banquets, Jesus imparts wisdom as he shares the wine and grants forgiveness as he distributes the fish. This eight-chapter resource provides biblical insights along with thought-provoking queries regarding our own time, such as whom should we invite to Sunday dinner and who is left out and left behind in our culture today.

Preaching will coincide with the chapters each week.




"Bible Study for Everyone" Tuesdays at 10:30 AM.

Benefitting the Morrisville Food Center

In 1990, a simple prayer: "Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us be mindful of those who are without a bowl of soup to eat" was delivered to a small youth group at Spring Valley Presbyterian Church in Columbia, SC led by Brad Smith, who was serving as a seminary intern at the time.

This gave birth to an idea. Why not harness the energy and enthusiasm of Super Bowl weekend, a time when people come together for football, food and fun, to unite the nation for a higher good? Individuals and groups could collect dollars in soup pots and canned food for those in need and send every dollar and food donation DIRECTLY to a local charity of THEIR choice.

Did you know?

- 48 million Americans live in poverty? [1]
- 1 in 7 Americans face hunger every day? [1]
- More than 630,000 people in the United States are homeless? [2]
- 23% of those struggling went to college? [1]
- Or that 16 million children live in food insecure households? [1]

People across the nation work to fight hunger and poverty in their own communities around the time of the Super Bowl football game. A collection is taken up (many people use a soup pot), asking for one dollar or one item of food, which could be soup for people in need. 100% of our donation goes directly to the local hunger-relief charity of our choice.

For Northampton Presbyterian Church, the Morrisville Food Center is our designated recipient. In 2019 more than 8,00 groups collected over \$9.7 million and food for local hunger-relief charities. Since the pandemic, food insecurity has grown at a tremendous rate. Please help us grow this movement and tackle hunger in America!


