OUR GUEST MUSICIAN THIS MORNING IS MR. JUSTIN HARTZ:

While Trish takes a well-deserved vacation, we are once again delighted to welcome concert organist Justin Hartz! Mr. Hartz received his Bachelor of Music degree from Westminster Choir College, Princeton, New Jersey and Master of Music from The Juilliard School. He is the recipient of numerous scholarships including an E. Power Biggs Fellow of The Organ Historical Society.



In 1989, Hartz began his association with Longwood Gardens in Kennett Square, Pennsylvania. At Longwood he performs recitals and sing-alongs as one of the Holiday season organists on the historic 10,010 Pipe Aeolian Organ, the largest residence pipe organ in North America.

Mr. Hartz performed the dedication recital of the restored E.M. Skinner organ at Biltmore Estate, Asheville, North Carolina. He has recorded numerous CD's and videos.

Mr. Hartz's interests include historically-informed performances on the piano and its predecessors. He is also an advocate for the reed organ. To that end, he has been interviewed by NPR affiliate WVIA, Scranton, for a recital he performed on a large two manual and pedal Estey reed organ last fall.
