CLG Questions

- 1. How do Jesus' instructions in Matthew 18:15-20 provide protection for those who are vulnerable?
- 2. Some translate Jesus' response to Peter's question in Matthew 18:22 as "seventy-seven times" and others translate it as "seventy times seven." What is the significance of this? How do you calculate the ambiguous math of grace?
- 3. What do you think of Jesus' step-by-step advice for dealing with conflict? Have you ever followed this when someone hurt you? How did that go? Are there any specific situations or circumstances where you would choose not to follow this advice?
- 4. Read Matthew 18:17 closely. Jesus tells the disciples to treat those who refuse to listen as they would a gentile or tax collector. How do you interpret his instruction? Based on how Jesus treats gentiles and tax collectors, what kind of treatment does he intend?
