This morning we welcome the **Rev. Kang Na** to our pulpit.

Rev. Na is the Pastoral Ministries Manager at Ann's Choice in Warminster. Before working in Pastoral Ministries at Ann's Choice, Kang was a professor for 21 years at Westminster College (New Wilmington, PA), where he taught courses on the Bible, biblical interpretation, theology, and philosophy. His area of specialty is the New Testament (Paul's letters in particular) and hermeneutics (the science of interpretation). The son of first-generation Christians, he was baptized in South Korea, moved to Tennessee just before turning ten, and since then has lived, studied, taught, and served churches in various places in New Jersey, Korea, Atlanta, Germany, and New York City. He earned an AB and MDiv at Princeton Theological Seminary, and a PhD at Emory University, with further studies at Göttingen University in Germany. Kang enjoys music (violin, guitar, piano, singing), food (cooking and eating), exercising, computers and tech gadgets, traveling, fixing things, and riding his Harley. The most significant among his many passions are his wife, Amy, pastor of Ivyland Presbyterian Church, and their three children, Christian (25), Laura (23) and Sofia (22).
