#### Christian Life Groups—Questions for Discussion:

#### John 10:1-10

- 1. What gates do you experience on a regular basis? Gated communities? Airport gates? Gates on a playground? What are they for? To keep people out? Safe? To make a boundary or a barrier? How do they help or hinder the image of Jesus as the gate?
- 2. "Gatekeeping" is defined as "the activity of controlling, and usually limiting, general access to something." Does the church participate in this kind of gatekeeping? When have you witnesses or experienced "gatekeeping" and what, if anything did you do about it?
- 3. How do we recognize Jesus' voice? What do we hear him saying?
- 4. Are you part of any communities that are fluid with changing members, comings and goings? Why do our communities get so "fixed" so quickly? Is there an argument to be made for communities that remain the same over time? Is there an argument against?
