In *Owls and Other Fantasies: Poems and Essays*, one of her many volumes of poetry, the late Mary Oliver frames with her words a murmuration of starlings. They move as one, a visual invitation to other starlings to join their group in roosting for the night. Scientists surmise this keeps the birds warm, safe from larger predators at night, and allows for the free-sharing of information regarding the closest source of food.

In reading this beautiful poem, I could not help but think of our human need to gather as one for warmth and protection (and not a little information-sharing), especially in the depths of winter. In a month that will see the convergence of ice and snow, hearts and ashes; when grief weighs heavy for many and spring seems very far away, the signs of life surround us in nature's amazing display of solidarity.

This is an image the church needs in the winter of its life, when we have lost our cherished signposts and the way forward has been all but obscured. On top of that, you collected \$725 in Walmart gift cards!! These will be a huge help in addressing the requests from the teachers and administrators at our schools on the Navajo reservation.

They will be used to purchase much needed cleaning supplies for their families as well as some snack items. We recently learned that the Bureau of Indian Education no longer allows schools to use their food budget to purchase snacks for the children which are so important at the end of the day ... for many children, these snacks serve as their dinner.

Just thought you'd like to know the first use of those awesome Walmart cards. Dr. Billie was referred to us from one of our favorite teachers at Mariano Lake and we know Wingate Schools from our work with the elementary children.

Dr. Billie wrote:

Thank you all for the response and willingness to support. I teach high school students and every day they share how hungry they are. Our school provides wholesome and "home-cooked" meals which the students do actually enjoy. We also have cultural meals at least twice a month. However, I still get students who drop by my classroom and inquire as to if I have any snacks. I was doing this on my own for a few weeks and it was getting pretty pricey for me.

So we are setting him up with a bunch of snacks and also bought a mini-fridge so he can get fresh fruit, which we are working with the Pantry to provide.


